

ECWZ Cart for Classic ASP v1.x.

Thank you for purchasing ECWZ cart on classic ASP v1.x.

This documentation contains the Quick Start guide for you to configure the shopping cart software in few simple steps.

Note: To proceed with the quick start instruction, you must finish the installation of the ECWZ Cart for classic ASP v1.x.

Quick Start Instruction:

1. Configure the online store information and store options:

With your ECWZ Cart, you can configure the online store with different options such as to allow stock inventory control or the option to save customer's credit card information into the customer database. These settings can be setup in the following pages:

Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Store Profile

Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Store Setting

Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Store Option

2. Select your payment method and the type of credit card you wish to take:

Go to Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Gateway Setting to configure the type of payment method you want to take in this online store. Once you are done, go to the Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> List Credit Card and you will be able to enable/disable the type of credit card you want to take for credit card based payment.

3. Create additional store operators and different level of access:

To create different level of access, you can go to Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Operator Role. Once you have done creating different type of role with different access rights, you can go to Admin back-end -> Store Configuration -> Store Operator to create additional store operators to login.

4. Setting up the Online Catalog:

In order to add products, you need to define the product categories, product option groups and related product groups first. To create a product category, go to Admin back-end -> Product Management -> Category Setting. To create product option group, go to Admin back-end -> Product Management -> Option Group. A typical option group would be "size" if you are selling clothing. To create related product group, go to Admin back-end -> Product Management -> Related Product. Once you are done with these setups, you can start adding products into your catalog by going to Admin back-end -> Product Management -> Product Setup.

5. Define Shipping zone, shipping rules and tax rate:

To define shipping rate and shipping zone, go to Admin Back-end -> Shipping & Localization -> Country Settings and Admin Back-end -> Shipping & Localization -> State Settings. At these two places, you will be able to define the shipping zone and tax rate for these locations. Note: If a city input by online customer is not found, then this shopping cart will go to the country and use country's shipping zone and tax rate instead. Once you have defined the tax rate and shipping zone, it is time to add the shipping methods. You can go to Admin Back-end -> Shipping & Localization -> Shipping Method to define the shipping methods (i.e. FedEx three day shipping). Once a shipping method is defined, then you will be able to create shipping rules based on the purchasing amount or the total weight of an order. To define shipping rules, go to Admin Back-end -> Shipping & Localization -> Shipping Rules.

6. Add optional text information for your online store:

There are several different types of text-based information you can add for your online store. This information includes meta tags value, terms and conditions, store footers and any extra page information. You can setup this information at Admin Back-end -> Text Configuration.

7. Customize the store-front languages:

ECWZ Cart for Classic ASP v1.2 can be fully customized to support foreign languages. You can replace any text you see on this online store (text information including store-front navigations and any response text message returned upon any type of form submission). To update the store language text, go to Admin Back-end -> Store Configuration -> Store Language. Just follow the instruction and you will be able to fully customize the store text.

8. Start selling your products:

Up to this point, you have successfully configured the online store and you have added items into the online catalog. Congratulations, now your store is officially online and Internet users will be able to browse your online catalog and make purchase on your items.
